Welcome to the London Festival of Architecture 2015, a month-long, city-wide celebration of architecture and the built environment, presenting London as a global hub of architectural practice, experimentation, teaching and debate.

We are delighted to present this year's festival programme, which we hope you agree, offers a fascinating range of events from talks to tours, exhibitions to workshops, taking place across London throughout June.

One of the common threads linking this diversity is the response to this year's theme—*Work in progress*. Through the festival, we have offered people a chance to explore the

changing nature of work, and workspace, but also its impact on, and role in, the evolution of London. After all, London exists because of its commercial roots, as a place of production, the exchange of goods and services.

This has defined our city and its architecture. The profession has always both responded to, and driven, change in society, and this recent state of flux has led to the architectural process also adapting to new demands and issues, working through ideas to offer new solutions. The Open Studios and discussions will offer a chance to reflect and reveal this 'work in progress'.

Work, and London's industry—in the widest sense of the word—

is fundamental not only to the economy and the functioning of the city, but our lives, well-being and sense of self. It is also intrinsically bound up in the image of London overseas; and now its reputation as a world leader in financial services is matched by its position as a global leader for the creative industries.

The capital's architectural talent is part of this success story and it is for that reason we are starting to expand the festival's international reach, to celebrate, and amplify, the creative and technical talent that resides in our city. Several major events will take place during the festival, bringing an international dimension to the month's activity, including the World Architecture Festival's UK showcase, the RIBA's Designing City Resilience and our first ever Focus Country.

The inaugural position goes to Ireland. Working in partnership with Irish Design 2015, a year-long international celebration of Irish design, and the British Council, the festival presents a month of events, workshops and installations (see page 20).

The other common thread running through the festival is the people who actually make it what it is, and support us in what we set out to achieve. So, a huge thanks to all who have brought this into being by putting your time, talent and love for London into co-creating such a varied, thought-provoking and stimulating London Festival of Architecture 2015.

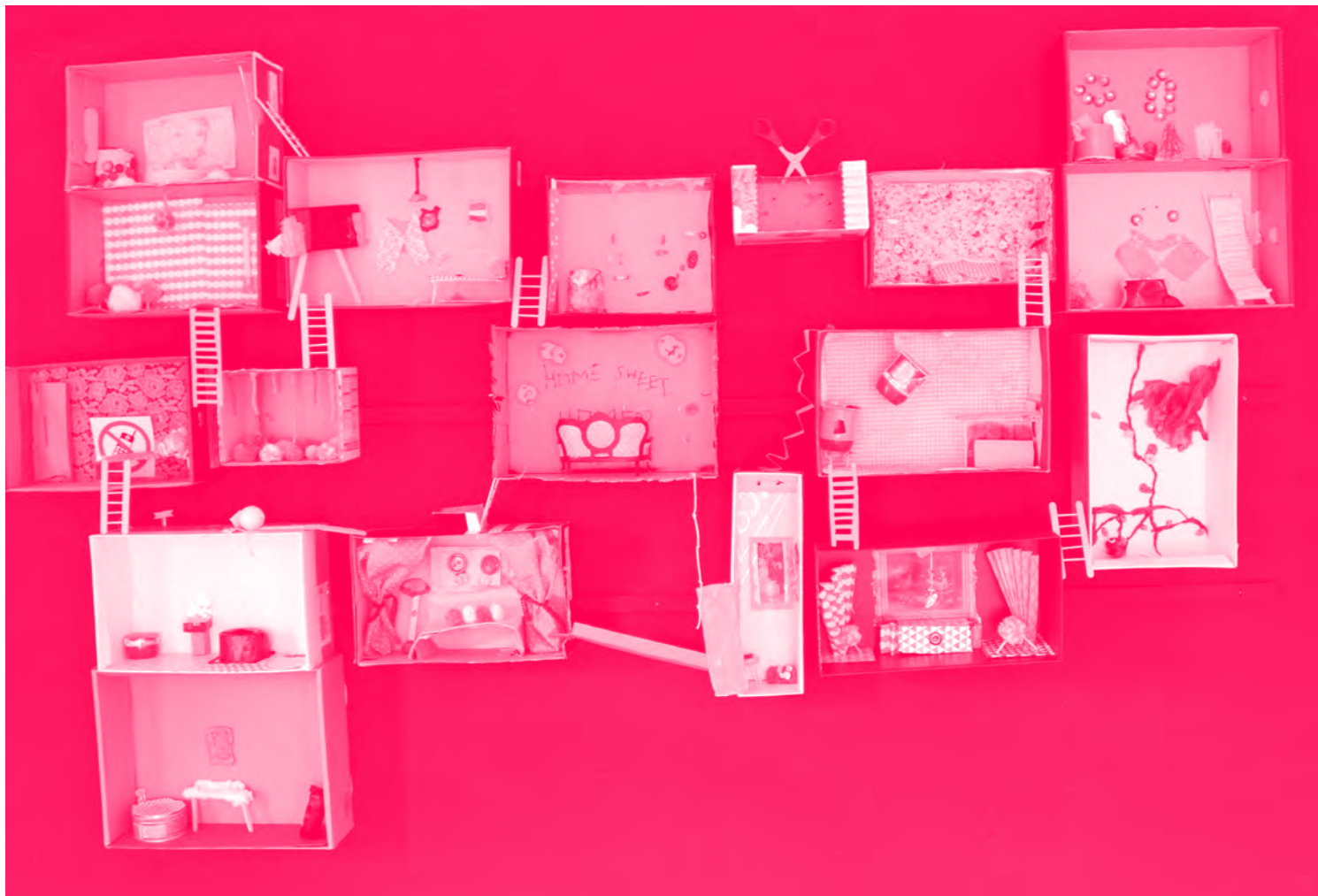

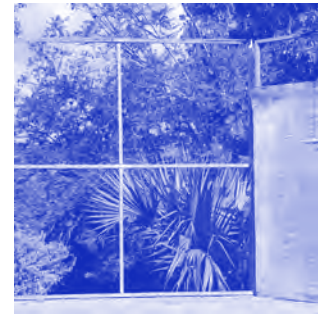
